

Palliative Performance Scale



The Karnofsky Palliative Performance Scale (PPS) is a tool used to assess a patient's functional performance and to determine progression toward end of life. It is a helpful reference in timing the goals-of-care conversation with patients and their families. Patients with a PPS score <70% may be appropriate for hospice care; however, this scale and rating does not take the place of a physician's professional judgement.
